For the safety and security of the general public and exhibit animals, please be advised of the following:

- This is a smoke-free and alcohol-free event. Cigarette smoking and recreational cannabis use, including vaping are prohibited. Alcohol found on the fairgrounds will be confiscated by Security personnel and not recovered.
- No Dogs or pets are allowed on the fairgrounds during the Fair. Only trained Service Animals or animals directly involved in exhibits or contests are permitted on the fairgrounds during the Fair.

Skateboarding, bicycle riding, recreational scooter riding and/or rollerblading are not permitted.

PLEASE NOTE, NEW THIS YEAR:

Backpack Policy: For general public safety, no backpacks will be allowed into the park. Those who walk to the gates, with a backpack, will be refused entry. Those who drive in will be asked to return them to their vehicles. Clear stadium bags are acceptable as long as the contents are visible. All other bags, large purses, etc., may be searched. Diaper bags are acceptable as long as an infant is present.

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RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All LIVESTOCK exhibitors AND every person arriving with them MUST preregister on ASSISTEXPO by NOON, SEPTEMBER 3 2023. For help with this
process, please visit www.uxbridgefair.ca and follow the links. Alternately, you can
email registrationsupport@uxbridgefair.ca. Each registered person will be issued a
free wristband, which can be picked up at the fair office on Wednesday evening,
September 6 and Thursday evening, September 7, between 6 and 9 p.m. Preregistration is required by Durham Health for contact tracing and total person
count on the property. Anyone arriving who has NOT been pre-registered WILL
NOT be allowed on the property.

Exhibitors who are out of town and cannot come Sept. 6 or 7 to pick up their wristbands, must show their online entry printout at the gate for admission onto the Fairgrounds, and then come to the Fair office to pick up their free wristbands upon arriving on the day of competition.

ENTRY FEE OF 10% WILL BE DEDUCTED FROM ALL PRIZE WINNINGS IN ADULT CLASSES IN ALL DIVISIONS.

- **2.** All Livestock entries **MUST** include the Uxbridge Fair Premises ID # **ON4232599**.
- 3. Entry tags must be firmly attached to every animal or article being shown. All exhibitors of livestock must have a numerical entry tag for admission to the show ring. *Incomplete* entry tags may result in disqualification.
- **4**. Every animal or article entered for competition must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor and all articles shown must have been grown, produced or manufactured by the exhibitor since the last exhibition.
- 5. Age of stock date from January 1, except cattle, to date from July 1.
- 6. No animal shall be allowed to compete in more than one class of a section, except in herd, or for sweepstake, or special, and no person will be allowed to make more than one entry in any section other than animals.
- 7. Cattle must be on the grounds by 11:00 a.m., unless otherwise stated in the corresponding section rules, or it will be the option of the judges whether they will be judged or not. All animals must be securely tied while on the grounds. Exhibitors must have liability insurance.

- 8. Judges have discretionary power to withhold a prize whenever an animal or article is considered not worthy or not in accordance with the rules of the Society.
- 9. Any person conversing or interfering with the judges while on duty will forfeit any right to a prize.
- 10. In case of protest, it must be made in writing and deposited with the Secretary on the day of the Fair. It must state plainly the cause of complaint and be accompanied with a deposit of Twenty (\$20.00) Dollars which may be forfeited to the Society in case of the protest not being sustained.
- 11. The Secretary will pay the prize money by cheque except as noted on certain Sections. Please read the rules of the Section you are interested in carefully. *Any prize cheque not cashed by November 30th will be forfeited to the Society.* In the event of lack of funds to pay prizes in full, a percentage will be paid to all prize winners alike. Winnings will be mailed by October 31, 2023.
- 12. The statute provides that the Society shall have control of the grounds and for a distance of 300 yards surrounding the same. Privileges for refreshment booths and for sale of goods on or adjacent to the grounds and hall must be arranged with the Space Rental/Vendor Chairperson Deb Dickie, 905 852-5040 or email dddickie@sympatico.ca
- 13. Though every reasonable precaution will be taken by the Directors to ensure the safety of articles, it is understood that the exhibits are placed at the owner's risk and the Society is not in any way liable for injury or theft to competitors and/or exhibits while on exhibition.
- 14. The Society recognizes the right of privacy of individuals with respect to their personal information. Information collected will be used solely for communication and the business of the Society.
- 15. Please be advised that members of agents of the Uxbridge-Scott Agricultural Society ("U.S.A.S.") will be taking photographs and videos for advertising and commercial use during the Uxbridge Fall Fair and other related Society activities, *such as livestreaming on our social media accounts*. The U.S.A.S. reserves the exclusive right to photograph all participants, attendees, performers, exhibitors and volunteers (without exception). Your attendance at a U.S.A.S. event constitutes consent to be photographed for use in print or electronic publicity solely by the U.S.A.S.. To ensure the privacy of individuals and children, images will not be identified using full names or personal identifying information without the written approval of the photographed subject, parent, or legal guardian. If you object to your likeness being used, please come to the Fair Office **PRIOR** to the *START* of the Fair and provide your full name, address and telephone number and

allow us to photograph you in order to have your likeness excluded. Forms may be obtained at the Uxbridge Public Library or Township Office before September 1st.

- 16. Any inappropriate or abusive handling of animals may be subject to disqualification and/or ejection from the grounds.
- 17. No refunds will be issued due to inclement weather and/or resulting cancelled event.

FAIR MANAGER'S TIPS ON SURVIVAL

For many people, a trip to a local Agricultural Fair is a new experience and these tips will allow everyone to have a great experience. Having fun is the priority!

- 1. Arrive early for the evening events. Parking and seating is limited. 5:30 p.m. recommended.
- 2. Please do not park in the "accessible parking spots" without a permit. You will get a ticket.
- 3. Check the weather forecast before you leave home and bring appropriate clothing.
- 4. Bring bug spray and sun block.
- 5. Bicycles, skateboards and drones are not allowed in the Park.
- Safety glasses and ear guards are recommended for some of our evening events.
- 7. First Aid is on the property to deal with health issues. If you may require an Epi-pen, bring it.
- 8. In case of extreme weather, tents, trees and metal bleachers are not safe. Exit to your vehicle or find shelter in a fixed building.
- 9. All the Fair staff and directors are on the property to help you have a good event. Don't hesitate to ask for assistance.
- 10. Since the Fair grounds are in midtown, we do try to have everything quiet by 11:00 p.m. Please help with this.
- 11. A caregiver, accompanying a special needs person is admitted free.
- 12. **If you see an incident that requires a 911 response**, please go directly, quickly, to the Main Office or contact them by phone at **905-852-7745** and allow them to make the call. Having the emergency vehicle arrive at the correct gate

- 5. Animals less than 6 months of age AT THE DATE OF THE SHOW whose registration certificates are applied for, but have not been received by owner from CLRC may show, providing the owner provides a copy of the application form that was sent to CLRC.
- 6. The Original Registration Certificate (or access to the CLRC website for Bulk Paperless registrations) must be available upon request from the Show Secretary/show Chairman during the entire show. **Tattoos legible and to match paperwork.**
- 7. Date for computing of age is September 9, 2023.
- 8. Exhibitors may enter 2 animals in each class to a maximum of 14 goats per section and 20 goats total per exhibitor.
- 9. Exhibitors MUST pre-register their entries by noon, August 22, 2023 using AssistExpo. Please visit www.uxbridgefair.ca for details. Exhibitors may bring essential assistants. TERMS:

A.O.V. – Any other variety.

ANNUAL: An herbaceous plant which normally completes its cycle of seed in one year. Includes tender perennials such as pansies, snapdragons, etc. that are plants called "Annuals" grown as such in this region.

BIENNIAL: An herbaceous plant which requires two growing seasons to complete its normal growth i.e. from seed to seed.

BASICS IN JUDGING GARDEN VEGETABLES:

To avoid disqualification, please ensure all entries are displayed in proper containers, if mentioned, and conform to the class entered.

All specimens must be grown by the exhibitor!

Uniformity and trueness to type - 30%

Excellent condition and colour - 20%

Other factors: Freshness - Blemishes - Scarring - Maturity - Size - Texture -

Appearance - Properly trimmed (see below)

Helpful Hints: To avoid disqualification

- 1. Tomatoes Leave stem on, matched
- 2. Pumpkins or Squash Leave stem on, matched
- 3. Peppers Leave 1/2 inch of stem, matched
- 4. Garlic and Onions Do not peel or wash, just remove loose outer skin, leave tops 1" inch above bulb. Roots trimmed to 1/2", matched.
- 5. Carrots and Parsnips Leave 1 inch of top. Tap root intact, matched
- 6. Beets Leave 1 inch above crown. Roots trimmed back to no more than 1 inch, matched.
- 7. Cucumber Leave 1/4 inch of stem
- 8. Cabbage The outer leaves should be left on.
- 9. Corn 1/3 of husk should be removed from tip to butt.

- 10. Potatoes **Do Not Wash.** Brush lightly to remove loose soil. Do not damage skin.
